Our location places us in the position of enrolling students from three counties – Tipperary, Laois and Offaly. We have an experienced, committed staff that have an excellent record of meeting the needs of all students. Our philosophy is to encourage all students to strive to reach their full potential.

As a larger college we have the resources to offer an extensive range of subjects to our pupils. First year students engage in a Subject Taster System, where they sample various subjects before deciding which to study for their Junior Certificate. In Coláiste Phobal Ros Cré we take pride in the pastoral care we offer our students. Each pupil is treated as an individual and educated in a caring environment. We offer an extensive range of extra curricular activities.

After Junior Cycle our students can avail of our highly regarded Transition Year Programme, which is reviewed and enhanced on an annual basis. The success of the Transition Year Programme results in an over demand for the places available. In Senior Cycle, students have the choice of taking any one of the Leaving Certificate Programmes ie Traditional Leaving Certificate, Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme and the Leaving Certificate Applied Programme. Students have the opportunity to continue their education in our Post-Leaving Certificate Programme.

School Services

Supervised Study

The college offers supervised evening study facilities for pupils. This allows students a quiet, undisturbed two hour (one hour for 1st Years) period each evening



As part of our Literacy Initiative, Coláiste Phobal has developed new library facilities for our pupils. This provides a comfortable space where students can come and read or research books and also use PC's which are also available.



Coláiste Phobal operates a book rental scheme for all first and fifth year pupils. All students make a contribution of €75towards the scheme. This amount allows first years five books and fifth years four books.

Guidance and Counselling

Our aim is to provide education as part of a total life plan and to enable our students to become well balanced and a caring member of their community. Guidance and Counselling is provided by two fully qualified Guidance Counsellors who operate from a guidance suite, which provides the most modern facilities including Internet Access for the students.

Canteen Facilities

The school has an excellent canteen facility where students can avail of hot food for breakfast and lunch. This is a huge benefit to junior students who are not permitted down town at lunch time.

Information & Communication Technology (ICT)

The availability of ICT resources to support teaching and learning in subjects is very good. School management has a positive vision for the future development and integration of ICT.

Coláiste Phobal Ros Cré offers extensive IT facilities to its students. Our IT infrastructure offers staff the most up to date teaching aids and also provides a means of communicating more efficiently, both within the school and externally to parents and the community. The school has Wi-Fi throughout with 100mb broadband which facilitates efficient use of iPads and wireless devices. This facilitates access to internet and cloud applications which enhances the learning experience for pupils. The school has four fully equipped computer suites and four class sets of portable iPad trollies.

VS Ware

The school utilises this software to do roll checks and track pupils throughout the day. This is a web based system which allows parents better access to information on students' progress, attendance and conduct. The system can automatically send a text message to parents re absenteeism which helps to monitor and control attendance. Regular monitoring provides an instant progress report for parents and avoids waiting on end of term reports.

Parents are the primary educators of their children and while the school plays an important role in the preparation of students for life, it cannot achieve any significant progress without the complete and whole hearted support of parents. We see parents as vital co-partners in the educational process.

In order to strengthen the home / school relationship, parents are kept fully informed of their children's progress by:

- Monitoring VS Ware: A complete day-to-day account of a student's conduct attendance and achievement is recorded on VSWare.
- Contact with Year Head: Each year group has a Year Head who monitors the progress of students. Appointments with Year Heads can be arranged by contacting the school. Parents are always welcome in our school and they can be assured that we are always delighted to see them.
- Parent / Teacher Meetings: Regular Parent / Teacher Meetings are held and every effort is made through parent programmes and lectures to help parents take an active interest in their children's education.

Discipline

Discipline and care go together and are sometimes considered to be two sides of the same coin. Our policy is to approach discipline as positively as possible. There is a code of conduct combining firmness with fairness and relying increasingly on self-discipline and responsibility as students move up through the school. A copy of the Rules is contained in the Journal and must be signed by students and parents at the start of the school year.

Learning Support

All students are assessed on entering the school. When students are found to have learning difficulties they are catered for by our comprehensive learning support programme administered by our team of trained learning support teachers. Our

programmes are designed to improve the student's confidence and ability which have proved to be most successful.

The school promotes the involvement of Parents through the Parents Association, the school newsletter and the school website. The quality of the home-school relationship is a strength of the school.

Religious Education

Religious Education is recognised as having a central role to play in the formation of the minds and characters of our students. In co-operation with the Diocesan Authorities of all denominations, a comprehensive, planned programme of religious instruction is implemented.

Invited guest speakers help to broaden the students' awareness, and the Pastoral Care programme is specifically aimed at giving each student as much individual attention as possible. Since its inception in 1999, Coláiste Phobal Ros Cré has been actively developing new facilites for students and teachers, one of which has been the Oratory. This is set in a quiet area of the school and every day, it is used for prayer services, class liturgies, meditation and personal prayer. For students and staff, it is a warm and welcoming place where they can spend some time in stillness and peace.

In Coláiste Phobal every effort is made to ensure that 1st Years settle in and are not at risk of being bullied. CAIRDE is a group of 6th Year students who volunteer to look out for 1st Years and to ensure that they settle in. Each year the response from the 6th Year students to join CAIRDE increases. Apart from making friends and keeping an eye on their designated class groups, the CAIRDE arrange special events to help the 1st Years integrate – e.g. Céilí, soccer leagues and CAIRDE afternoons. Surveys are also compiled to identify anybody who is feeling lost or lonely and to monitor how they are coping.

Transition Year

Our Transition Year pupils are entered for the Bronze Medal in this Award Scheme. The Presidents Award is the nations highest award to young people between the ages of 15 and 25 for personal excellence, achievement and voluntary service. The award programme essentially is about agreeing a challenge that participants will endeavor to reach within an agreed time scale.

The challenge is relative to one's ability. It sets out to develop the student as an individual and also to introduce the students to community involvement. To qualify for the award students must complete four sections:-

Leaving Certificate Programmes

As a large school, Coláiste Phobal Ros Cré has the resources to offer all three Leaving Certificate Programmes. All three have their merit and the choice of programme depends on the aspirations of the students and the outcomes they wish to achieve.

The Traditional Leaving Certificate

Having completed the Junior or Transition Year Programmes students in Coláiste Phobal progress to the Leaving Certificate Programme. Coláiste Phobal provides students with a broad range of subjects. Our facilities and excellent well qualified experienced staff have produced outstanding results over the years.

All the above subjects are available at Higher Level. Pupils must take at least six subjects including Irish.

Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme

Those students who opt for the regular Leaving Certificate can further enhance the programme and increase their points tally by signing up to the Leaving Certificate Vocational Programme. The L.C.V.P. is an enhanced Leaving Certificate, which includes a full Leaving Certificate plus Enterprise Education, Preparation for Work and Work Experience.

It provides students with a comprehensive career guidance programme with the added bonus of receiving additional certification and third level points.

To qualify for this programme, students must take:

- Two Leaving Certificate subjects from one of a list of Vocational Subject Groupings
- Other Leaving Certificate subjects must have Irish and Continental Language
- Three Link Modules

What is the Leaving Certificate Applied?

- The Leaving Certificate Applied is a programme based on continuous assessment rather than dependence on end of programme examinations. It allows students to remain focused by completion of short term tasks and assignments.
- It is a distinct, self-contained two year Leaving Certificate Programme aimed at preparing students for Adult and Working Life.
- It is to meet the needs of students who are not catered for by the two other Leaving Certificate Programmes

- It focuses on activity and skilled based learning and strong community links Aims of the Leaving Certificate Applied Prepares students for Adult and Working Life
- Develops numeracy and literacy skills
- Promotes communication and decision making skills
- Develops selfesteem and self confidence
- Recognises the talents of all pupils
