The College has established strong links with many employers in the area who provide wonderful experiences for learners through our work experience program. Many of our past students have found employment at the end of completing a course with us.

In our college you will be provided with state of the art IT facilities including a modern library, computer rooms and Microsoft Teams training.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do I apply for a place?

You can apply using the on-line application process at www.cpr.ie. Upon receiving your application a confirmation letter will be sent. However, if you have any difficulties you are welcome to call into the College for help and advice.

Do I have to apply through CAO?

You can now apply for any of our PLC courses (Further Education) through the CAO at www.cao.ie

When do I apply for a place on a course?

Applications can be made from January through to September. However, early booking is advised.

How will I know if my application has been successful?

You will receive a letter inviting you to attend the College for an interview in May. Any questions you have will then be answered and our tutors will help you decide if you have selected the course that is right for you. You will be notified within 2 weeks if your application has been successful. Please note Late applicants will be considered in Aug/Sept.

What are the course fees and how do I pay? There are no tuition fees payable to the College for EU nationals. However, learners are required to pay a registration fee of €50, exam fees, and some costs associated with course material fees. Details of which will be outlined during induction.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

I only have LCA can I apply?

The LCA is an acceptable entry qualification for all of our courses.

Can I get a grant to do a course?

Grants are available to those qualifying to complete a course with us and are administered by Student Universal Support Ireland (SUSI). For further information see www.studentfinance.ie or www.susi.ie Garda Vetting

Many of our courses which require students to complete work experience with children and/or vulnerable adults will require Garda Vetting. This will be completed at the beginning of the course by the course coordinator.

What happens if I have Additional Needs?

Students with special needs are very welcome on our courses and will be given one to one assistance and support with assignments.

Am I eligible for Vocational Training Opportunities Scheme (VTOS)?

If you are over 21 years of age and are unemployed and have been receiving specific social welfare payments for a minimum of six months, you are eligible to apply for the Vocational Training Opportunities Scheme (VTOS).

How do I qualify for Back to Education?

To qualify you must be at least 21 and be in receipt of a qualifying payment for a minimum of 3 months. Other criteria may apply.

Main Areas of Study

Care Support, Care Skills, Safety & Health at Work, Communications, Work Experience, Infection Prevention and Control, Activities of Living Patient Care, Care of the Older Person, Safe Patient Handling and CFR.

Employment opportunities

Healthcare assistant in acute hospitals, residential care centres and in community care settings.

NURSING STUDIES QQI LEVEL 5 (5M4349)

This Course is suitable for both school leavers
